

Protecting Houses of Worship: Lessons learned from Tree of Life Synagogue

House Bill 523 took effect in early 2016, legalizing medical marijuana in Ohio. Although the legislation established a basic framework for the program, it left the task of creating specific rules and guidelines for cultivation, processing, testing, dispensing and medical use to three state agencies. This presentation shares the state of Ohio Board of Pharmacy’s responsibilities regarding this program, and provides an overview of the board’s duties. Attendees will receive detailed information of the procedure for patient registration, and the laws and rules pertaining to the Medical Marijuana Control Program.

Now What?? *Preparing for Life after Police Work*

Course Description:

Every year hundreds of officers retire / resign from police work. Most retirees are a long way from Medicare age and how do you live on 60% of what wasn't enough in the first place? How do you take \$500 - \$1,500 per month out to pay for health insurance?

When many of us retire in our fifties, are we prepared financially, mentally, emotionally to live for another 30-40 years? Are we prepared for the shocking culture change, from the public sector to the "at will employment" of the private sector? This session will introduce concepts, attitudes, tools, and resources to the attendee, and challenge each one to a new way of thinking about their life after policing.

About our Speaker:

Dan Katt is a lifelong resident of Cincinnati, Ohio where he spent 27 years as a Cincinnati Police Officer, retiring in 2002 at the rank of Police Specialist (Detective). After retiring from the force, Dan began his second career as Corporate Loss Control Manager. Dan is responsible for plaintiff litigation, investigation and follow-up of serious vehicular accidents, corporate safety, security, training, and maintaining a positive relationship with local law enforcement agencies and the community.

Post Overdose Response Team (PORT)

Course Description:

In this class you will learn about the **Post Overdose Response Team (PORT)**, created to focus on the current heroin epidemic within our communities. In 2017, nearly 300 people were referred to **PORT**. They were able to reach just over half of the victims referred to them directly or through their family members. The instructors, active members of **PORT**, will discuss what services this important team offers to overdose victims and their families, and explain how visits are performed, in an effort to bridge the gap between overdose victims and Law Enforcement.

Understanding Senate Bill 215

Information and Discussion on Changes to the Conceal / Carry Laws in 2022

Ohio's Senate Bill 215 will allow all adults 21 and over who can legally own a gun to conceal / carry. It also removes the requirement to tell law enforcement officers about the weapon unless asked. Utilizing Drones for Law Enforcement

Course Description:

Small Un-crewed Aerial Systems (UAS) or drones have become a vital tool for first responders in Ohio and across the nation. The use of drones for public safety purposes include crime scene mapping, suspect tracking, search and rescue, fire assessment, and many other applications. In fact, it has been noted in 2020 that nearly 1,500 public safety entities are said to be using drones. Of these, over two-thirds are county sheriff and municipal police departments, followed by fire departments and state and county emergency management agencies.

This session will provide an overview of UAS and outline the process for developing a drone program for public safety purposes. Specific topics include applicable policies and procedures, available technologies, training, and cost of implementation.



Michael Blankenship Memorial Service Award



This year marks the 25th anniversary of the tragic death of Ohio State University Police Officer, Michael Blankenship. In February of 1997, Officer Blankenship was killed in the line of duty while responding to a call for service on the Ohio State University campus. Michael was a strong supporter of OCPA and crime prevention.

Since 1997, the Michael Blankenship award has been given annually as the Ohio Crime Prevention Association highest honor. This award recognizes a crime prevention practitioner whose life and work reflect a commitment to the philosophy and mission of the OCPA.
