Effective Crime Prevention has been seen as a key strategy in reducing crime and violence in our communities. This comprehensive course is designed to address local community needs ranging from physical security to violence prevention. The course is tailored to the needs of today's crime prevention and community policing practitioners, and places great emphasis on programmatic initiatives giving the practitioners the knowledge, tools and resources to do their jobs successfully.

Crime Prevention is the anticipation, recognition and the appraisal of a crime risk and the initiation of some action to remove or reduce it. Crime Prevention means working partnership, rather than in isolation, and working with concerned citizens to address ways to prevent crime and drug abuse. It means communities and individual citizens learning how to protect themselves and to work together to keep their neighborhoods crime and drug free. It means law enforcement working with communities, businesses, and service organizations to develop action plans based on information about crime and other problems.

### TOPICS TO BE COVERED INCLUDE:

- History & Theory of Crime Prevention:** Historical overview, theory, and practice
- Professional Resource & Development:** Community programs, youth issues and programs, crime analysis, crime prevention marketing, presentation and facilitation, time management, identity and growing potential leaders, challenges
- Homeland Security:** Emergency Response Security
- Physical Security:** Burglary prevention, facility security, farm/rural crime prevention, loss prevention, crime prevention through environment design (CPTED)
- Personal Safety and Security:** Personal safety, crime prevention for youth, crime prevention for seniors, prevention of cyber crimes, violence prevention
